## Another successful month for Colorado in September

### Opening of Distillery - Borodale House, Raasay

The official opening of Raasay Distillery took place on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2017 with the 'Isle of Skye' Pipe Band piping in the new industry onto the island. R&B Distillers' Raasay Distillery has been constructed at the site of a former Victorian hotel 'Borodale House' which





had been empty since 2006.

The site will make the first legal whisky on the small island off Skye. In the past, it was made illegally using illicit stills as it was in other parts of Scotland.

Colorado started works in June 2016 overcoming a number of unique issues.

Deliveries having to be planned and organised to fit in with the regular ferry service. Pre-commencement surveys identified the UK's most north-westerly population of

brown long-eared bats, found in the vacant hotel. To accommodate the coven the site has bat boxes and a "bat hotel", providing a nesting space for the mammals in the roof of the distillery. The visitor centre opens to the public next month
