## **Inchdairnie Distillery**

Our relationship with Inchdairnie Distillery, a lower tier COMAH site in Fife, continues apace as in addition to maintenance works which have been carried out under an ongoing contract, there has been an additional project to design and construct 2 new maturation warehouses (numbered 13-14) next to the existing warehouses with enabling works for future units to be added. This project also included the construction of a New Finishing Warehouse and an extension to the existing Control Room - additional foul and surface water drainage has been incorporated and connected into the existing systems and pond.

This work is part of an ongoing expansion of the production capacity of the Distillery, with major investment in this relatively new whisky producing facility in the heart of Fife and represents a further boost for the local economy.





### **Emergency Works over Christmas Break**
